- Prepare instruments for sterilization;
- Utilize the principles of team dentistry;
- Obtain and analyze dental radiographic images;
- Assist dentists in dental public health, endodontics, oral and maxillofacial pathology, radiology and surgery, orthodontics, periodontics, prosthodontics, and pediatric dentistry;
- Mix various dental materials;
- Maintain patient records and order supplies;
- Practice established infection control procedures;
- Provide oral healthcare instructions and more.
